

ARUNCUS ‘Misty Lace’

Origin: Introduced by Dr. Allan Armitage, University of Georgia

Species: *hybrida*

Protection Status: Plant Patent # 15,798

Characteristics:

‘Misty Lace’ Aruncus, commonly known as “goatsbeard”, is an exciting new, dwarf hybrid with delicate creamy white flower panicles in early spring, fern-like leaves and red stems. As an early spring bloomer, it grows best in part shade. The habit is upright and forms a mature clump 2.5 feet tall x 2 feet wide. Unlike most Aruncus, **‘Misty Lace’** is both heat and humidity tolerant and it’s very cold hardy too! **‘Misty Lace’** is great used in shady perennial gardens, containers, and woodland gardens.

Hardiness: USDA 3 - 7

Bloom: Creamy white flowers appear in early spring

Foliage: Green, fern-like foliage

Habit: Dwarf, compact habit. 2.5 feet tall x 2 feet wide

Propagation: Tissue culture and division. *License required to propagate.*

Culture: Typical gardening soil mix best to incorporate into planting bed. Best if planted in part shade with East or Southeast exposure. Moderate moisture.
