

CONVOLVULUS 'Moroccan Beauty'

Origin: Selected in a commercial crop of Convolvulus 'Full Moon' in Australia in 2000

Species: *sabatius*

Protection Status: US PP #15,104; COPF Open

Characteristics:

'**Moroccan Beauty**' was selected from a growing commercial crop for its dense growth habit with short internodes. This produces more flower power than other convolvulus in cultivation. See comparison image below. It is very tolerant of heat. Because of its tightly compact and trailing habit, '**Moroccan Beauty**' is an ornamental landscape plant suitable for use as a groundcover and as a hanging basket or in a mixed container.

Hardiness: USDA Zones 9 - 11

Bloom: One-inch Purple-blue blooms that last for several days

Foliage: Medium-green furry, dime-sized foliage

Habit: Tightly compact, prostrate and trailing habit

Propagation: Vegetative stem cuttings. *License required for propagation.*

Culture: Plant in full sun or light shade, and well-drained soil with moderate water. Time and temperature to develop roots on initial cutting: 14-21 days are needed to develop roots on initial cuttings at air temperature of 60° to 75° F. Time to develop to commercial container size: 6-9 months are needed to produce a 1-litre container plant from a rooted cutting.
