

## ERIGERON ‘Spindrift’

Origin: Bred by Australian Breeder in Melbourne, Byran Jackson.

Species: *Erigeron karvinskianus*

Protection Status: US Plant Patent #14,834

### Characteristics:

The Santa Barbara Daisy is known as a weedy plant in cheap landscapes. ‘**Spindrift**’ changes all of that! This well-behaved, beautifully mounded variety keeps a tight shape of long blooming mass of flowers. You’ll wonder where the foliage hides! Profuse blooms open white and fade to rose, and leave behind a “nearly sterile” seed head. Flowers continue to bloom around the old, making them unnoticeable. Grow ‘**Spindrift**’ for its amazing performance in the landscape, and its great habit in monoculture containers.

Hardiness: Zone 7, likely hardier.

Bloom: Masses of tiny daisies, opening white aging to rose.

Foliage: There’s foliage on this plant?

Habit: Mounding and round, like a flower snowball. 10”-12” high, same width.

Propagation: Vegetative cuttings. *License required for propagation.*

Culture: Full to partial sun. Well-drained soil.
