Protection Status:	PPAF.
USDA Zone:	Zone 6. (-10°F or -23°C). (Second Year Testing - Zone 5b).
Bloom:	Masses of cream, blue-green & red colorful bracts.
Bloom Time:	Early summer - fall.
Foliage:	Colorful cream-golden yellow & blue-green variegated foliage, blushed pink in cooler temperatures.
Habit:	Compact bushy habit. 20" x 20".
Propagation:	Softwood cuttings. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
Culture:	Well-drained soil in full sun.
Additional Comments:	Drought tolerant once established.
Uses:	Pots & Containers, Garden Border, Modern landscape.

Approximate Finishing Time

4.5" Quarts:	6-8 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting).
6" Gallons:	10-12 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting).
