

EUPHORBIA 'Ruby Glow'

Origin: Found in a nursery crop in England

Species: *hybrida*

Protection Status: Patent rights asserted

Characteristics:

'**Ruby Glow**' has a great habit, is very branched and compact, and presents well in a pot. Its foliage is mahogany in lower light levels and is virtually black in full sun. New foliage is an attractive red. When propagated, there has been no reversion problems observed to date. Trial sites believe that it is different enough from 'Blackbird' to be marketed in its own right. E. "Ruby Glow" can be used as an ornamental plant in gardens and containers for its eye-catching appearance and flowers.

Hardiness: USDA zones 6 - 11

Bloom: Typically, the flowers have dark red bracts greater than 1 cm (.5 ") in size

Foliage: Ruby to chocolate brown and heading towards black in full sun

Habit: Compact, sturdy

Propagation: *License required for propagation.*

Culture: for the gardener, needs little care, but requires sunlight and a certain amount of environmental humidity.

Use: in the perennial border and as a container item
