

EUPHORBIA 'Tasmanian Tiger'

Origin: In 1993 **'Tasmanian Tiger'** was discovered and selected by Australian plantswomen in a cultivated area of Tasmania, Australia.

Species: *Euphorbia characias ssp wulfenii variegata*

Protection Status: US PP # 15,715; Canadian PBR rights asserted; COPF Open.

Characteristics:

'Tasmanian Tiger' is an ornamental plant selected for its eye-catching variegated leaves which feature gray-green centers and white margins. The overall plant has a compact rounded growth habit, pale green stems and tall flower spikes covered with cream-white flowers. The leaf color of **'Tasmanian Tiger'** is uniform and consistent, and the plant exhibits a vigorous growth habit. The bracts are also variegated with white/cream edges and green bow-tie centers. **'Tasmanian Tiger'** is ideal as a specimen or in rock gardens, perennial beds, and containers.

Hardiness: USDA Zone 6.

Bloom: Bracts are variegated white/cream with a green bow tie shaped splotch in the center; emerge in spring.

Foliage: Green centers with white/cream margins.

Habit: 36"x 36"

Propagation: Cuttings and tissue culture. *License required for propagation.*

Culture: Prune blooms back to the base following blooming. Full sun, well-drained soil.
