

EUPHORBIA TINY TIM ('WALEUPHRUD')

Origin: Selected by English plantsman Tim Crowther of West Sussex, England

Species: *Euphorbia x martinii*

Protection Status: US PP#16,930; Canadian COPF Registration.; COPF Open

Characteristics:

Tiny Tim' is a compact *martinii*, growing to 10 - 12" in flower, depending on planting conditions. Flowers are light cream, similar to *martinii* but smaller. This dwarf sport of *martinii* flowers for ages so remains saleable for a very long time. **Tiny Tim**' is an ideal plant to include in mixed containers, as a front of the border perennial or in the annual border. Extremely long flowering, its tightly mounded habit maintains its form over time. **Tiny Tim**' resembles a miniature version of the species and parent, *Euphorbia martinii*. Easy to root with many cuttings.

Hardiness: USDA Zones 6b – 8

Bloom: Long-lived, bright red centers set off by chartreuse outside.

Foliage: As *martinii* but much smaller. Small leaves are green with burgundy underside complimented with burgundy stems.

Habit: Compact and dome shaped.

Propagation: Cuttings. *License required for propagation.*

Culture: Prune blooms back to the base following blooming. Full sun, well-drained soil.
