Genus & Species:	<i>Euphorbia amygdaloides</i>
Protection Status:	U.S. Plant Patent # 22,200.
USDA Zone:	Zone 6-11. (-10°F or -23°C).
Bloom:	Masses of fresh apple green bracts.
Bloom Time:	Early summer - fall.
Foliage:	Unique ruby red new foliage with contrasting bright cherry red stems.
Habit:	Squat compact-spreading habit. 16" x 20".
Propagation:	Softwood cuttings. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
Culture:	Well-drained soil in full sun.
Additional Comments:	Drought tolerant once established. Prune flowering stem hard back to the base after blooming has finished.
Uses:	Pots & Containers, Garden Border, Modern landscape.

Approximate Finishing Time

4.5" Quarts:	6-8 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting).
6" Gallons:	10-12 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting).
