

## *Euphorbia Rudolph* ('Waleuphrud')

### Characteristics

<b>Genus &amp; Species:</b>	<i>Euphorbia martinii</i>
<b>Protection Status:</b>	PP17,257, COPF Open.
<b>USDA Zone:</b>	Zone 6-8. (-10°F or -23°C).
<b>Bloom:</b>	Masses of fresh apple-green colored bracts.
<b>Bloom Time:</b>	Early summer - fall.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Unique ruby red winter foliage / nose color.
<b>Habit:</b>	Squat compact-spreading habit. 16" x 20".
<b>Propagation:</b>	Softwood cuttings. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
<b>Culture:</b>	Well-drained soil in full sun.
<b>Additional Comments:</b>	Drought tolerant once established. Prune flowering stem hard back to the base after blooming has finished.
<b>Uses:</b>	Pots & Containers, Garden Border, Modern landscape.

### Approximate Finishing Time

4.5" Quarts:	6-8 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting).
6" Gallons:	10-12 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting).

**Closest Variety:** *E. Tiny Tim*
