Genus & Species:	<i>Euphorbia x martinii</i>
Protection Status:	PP16,930, COPF Open.
USDA Zone:	Zone 6b. (-5°F or -23°C).
Bloom:	Masses of long lived fresh appled green bracts with bright red centres.
Bloom Time:	Early spring - fall.
Foliage:	Small fresh green foliage with blushed burgundy undersides & stems.
Habit:	Tiny compact rounded habit. 12" x 12".
Propagation:	Softwood cuttings. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
Culture:	Well-drained soil in full sun.
Additional Comments:	Drought tolerant once established. Bracts antique exceptionally well giving a long period of season of interest. Test result show great heat tolerance. Surviving a scorching 116°F heat wave.
Uses:	Pots & Containers, Garden Border, Modern landscape.

Approximate Finishing Time

4.5" Quarts:	6-8 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting).
6" Gallons:	10-12 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting).

Closest Variety: *E. Ring Wing*
(*'Charam'*)

 ✓ **Tiny Tim** small green foliage **vs.** medium green foliage.
