

## GERANIUM 'Westray'

**Origin:** Bred by Scottish Geranium specialist, Alan Bremner of Scotland

**Species:** *Geranium x cantabrigiense*

**Protection Status:** US Plant Patent #13,716, COPF Open.

### Characteristics:

'**Westray**' exhibits all the long-blooming and carpeting characteristics of this original cross between *G. macrorrhizum* and *G. dalmaticum*. The near-sterile flowers, which are mid-pink and good sized, are long lasting and profuse. They are held erect above the foliage, which achieves a moderately dense 12-inch diameter during the first growing season. The closest companion might be considered 'Cambridge', however, '**Westray**' is shorter than 'Cambridge' and yet taller than *dalmaticum*. The overall height of '**Westray**', including the tidy flower canopy, is 12 inches. '**Westray**' is a versatile landscape plant, worthy of inclusion in the border, or in a rock garden or ground cover situation.

**Hardiness:** USDA Zone 5 to Zone 9

**Bloom:** Profuse, strong, clear pink flowers on stems of 8-10". Near-sterile.

**Foliage:** Dense, semi-evergreen, with an orangey tint in the fall.

**Habit:** 12" x 12"

**Propagation:** Division and cuttings, which are plentiful and easy to root. *License required to propagate.*

**Culture:** Moist soil, full sun to partial shade.
