

LAVANDULA from Australia

"Ruffles & Lace" Series

Origin: Bred by Australian lavender specialist Steve Eggleton.

Species: *Lavandula stoechas*

Characteristics: The wings on the Lace varieties are longer and more pronounced than most of the Ruffles. Ruffles are more compact and rounded in habit. Both types are humidity tolerant but the Lace types are more tolerant than the Ruffles. Both Ruffles and Lace have shown to be more resistant to diseases than most other lavenders on the Australian market. With consistent pruning both types will continually re-bloom which makes them ideal for sales window targeted production. *

Hardiness: USDA Zone 8

Bloom: Profuse flowering in spring through summer of varying purple blooms.

Foliage: Gray-green, heavily dentate

Habit: Dense, mounding and upright 24"x 24"

Propagation: Cuttings. *License required for propagation.*

Culture: Full sun in well-drained soil.
