Genus & Species:	<i>Lavandula stoechas</i>
Protection Status:	COPF Registered; Canadian PBR Pending.
USDA Zone:	USDA Zone 8. (15°F or -12°C).
Bloom:	Profusions of blooms making a real splash of color early in the season.
Bloom Period:	Early spring – fall.
Foliage:	Grey-green aromatic foliage.
Habit:	Tight compact mounding habit 24" x 24".
Propagation:	Softwood Cuttings. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
Culture:	Full sun, well-drained soil.
Additional Comments:	Drought tolerant once established. Attracts bees and butterflies.
Uses:	Containers, Borders, Mass Landscape Planting.

Approximate Finishing Time

4.5" Quarts:	4-6 weeks from a 128 plug (Spring Planting).
6" Gallons:	8-10 weeks from a 128 plug (Spring Planting).
