Bloom:	Mid-blue flowers.
Bloom Time:	Early summer - fall.
Foliage:	Dark green & gold variegated needle like foliage giving an overall chartreuse look. High oil count. Great for cooking.
Habit:	Upright bushy habit. 12" x 12".
Propagation:	Semi-ripe cuttings. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
Culture:	Well-drained soil in full sun. No sun burning issues.
Additional Comments:	Heat & drought tolerant once established. Sport of the culinary favorite <i>R.</i> 'Rex'.
Uses:	Pots & Containers, Garden Border, Modern landscape.

Approximate Finishing Time

4.5" Quarts:	6-8 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting).
6" Gallons:	10-12 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting).

Closest Variety: *R.* 'Lockwood de Forest' **Key Differences:** ✓ 'Gold Dust' variegated foliage **vs.** green foliage.
✓ 'Gold Dust' tight bushy habit **vs.** more open habit.
✓ 'Gold Dust' dark bloom color **vs.** paler blooms color.
