Bloom:	Sprays of showy iridescent mauve-purple blooms.
Bloom Period:	Summer – fall.
Foliage:	Mid green aromatic foliage.
Habit:	Compact rounded habit 24" x 24".
Propagation:	Tip Cuttings. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
Culture:	Full sun, well-drained soil.
Additional Comments:	Quick growing. Drought tolerant once established. Browse resistant – deer and rabbit.
Uses:	Containers, Borders, Landscape Planting.

Approximate Finishing Time

4.5" - Quarts:	4-6 weeks from a 128 plug (spring planting).
6" - Gallons:	8-10 weeks from a 128 plug (spring planting).

Closest Variety: *S. greggii*

- ✓ 'Ultra Violet' mid foliage **vs.** gray/green foliage.
- ✓ 'Ultra Violet' iridescent blooms **vs.** blooms red through white.
